

# Canadian Aboriginal Festival

Hamilton, Ontario – November 26th to 28th

It's Aboriginal Festival time at Copps Coliseum and Hamilton Place Theatre.

The critically acclaimed festival is the largest multi-discipline Aboriginal event in North America. It brings together Aboriginal peoples from every corner of Canada and the United States to demonstrate their talents in dance, music, cuisine, arts and crafts plus more.

The festival officially gets underway Friday evening with the Canadian Aboriginal Music Awards gala show in the Hamilton Place Theatre at 8:00 p.m. This year's show will be dedicated to "Veterans and Warriors" with a number of special performances. Join the many celebrities who annually attend the show featuring some of Canada's top musicians.

Saturday morning the gates at Copps Coliseum will open at 9:30 a.m. to give visitors the opportunity to shop at more than 200 booths, sample traditional cuisine and enjoy traditional performers on the main stage.

Saturday's main feature at 1:00 pm will be the start of North America's largest Pow Pow, bringing together more than 1,000 dancers in the Pow Wow Dance Circle in Copps Coliseum. The Grand Entry, in addition to the dancers, will include Veterans, Canadian military personnel, colour parties such as the Metis will swell the number of participants in the Grand Entry to more than 1,500.

During the day you will also enjoy many other features such as traditional craft demonstrations, story telling, fashion shows, traditional healers, etc.
